Fifth Race Day of the Summer Series, Sunday, August 14

Once again we had one of those days when the NOAA weather forecast was way off as far as wind conditions on Cayuga Lake are concerned. The prediction was for 5-10 knots from the Northeast. For the centerboard races we had 10-12 knots from the Northwest, and for the keelboat race 15-20 knots from the Northwest with gusts to 30 knots.

For the centerboard races only two boats showed up, Peter Gould with his Laser and Susan and Vern Swenson with their Hobie Cat. They sailed two races to the Maplewood mark and back. The Swensons won the first race and Peter Gould the second.

Between the center-board and keelboat races, the Yacht Cub's Lightnings squeezed in a race of their own. While Byrne and Karen O'Brien's boat was approaching the finish line in the lead and under spinnaker, Karen fell overboard and Byrne had to quickly drop the chute and turn around to retrieve his wife. This cost him the race. But he had no choice. The rules say you have to finish with the same crew that you started with.

For the keelboat race—the fifth in the Johnson Cup Series—we had six boats competing. The course we sailed was twice around the following loop: From the Yacht Club to Maplewood, from there to East Shore, then to Sycamore, and from Sycamore back to the Yacht Club. Since it was so windy, no one set a spinnaker. One crew reports seeing 9 knots on their speedometer while running wing-and-wing. Line honors went to the C&C 30, LORELEI, skippered by Mel Richards. But LORELEI was bested on corrected time by the Sonar 23, AUJOURD'HUI, sailed by Peter Walsh and Wade Leftwich.
