Last Race of the Fall Series Sunday, October 16

The Fall Series—and the racing season—ended not with a whimper but a bang as we had gale-force northerly winds between 20 and 28 with gusts up to 40 knots.

Seven intrepid skippers and crews braved the elements: Two in A-Fleet and five in B-Fleet. The course we sailed went north to the Maplewood mark, from there due south all the way to the Pile Cluster, and then back up north to the start-finish line at the Yacht Club.

Everyone rounded up several times, and the crews on the smaller boats got very wet. Since no one dared to set a spinnaker, there were no spectacular broaches, and no one broke any gear, except for a broken boathook that the crew on FERGUS used as a whisker pole.

The expected cliffhanger duels between the points leaders didn't materialize: In A-Fleet, the C&C 30, LORELEI, pulled away to an early insurmountable lead over the Corsair 28, TREVELYAN, and in B-Fleet, the previous points leader, the J 24, SNITCH, wound up in third place, handing the series trophy to the J-24, MEHITABEL.

After the race, we all relaxed in the pub of the Yacht Club with free beer, Chinese minispring rolls, excellent hot chili, and beer-steamed hot dogs.
