our support for John in this challenging and exciting undertaking.

As many IYC members know, John grew up sailing at the Club and later spent several summers working at IYC as a sailing instructor in the Youth Sailing Program. Since then he has had a distinguished sailing career as an All American sailor at Hobart and William Smith, as a member of the U.S. Sailing Team, and as an assistant coach at Hobart and at Stanford University.

For the next several months John will be preparing for and then competing in the U.S. Olympic Trials to

be held October 3-14 in Newport, RI. He is finishing his job at the San Francisco Yacht Club this week (where he works as a sailing instructor with fellow IYC graduates Richard Feeney and Cameron Hoard) and then driving back East for the summer and fall. He plans to practice full time and compete in several East Coast regattas leading up to the Olympic Trials.
