Sheldrake Race and Party

Here is Richard Stephens' report:

We had five boats on the start line for the 2010 Sheldrake Cup race: INVICTUS (Catalina 30), SNITCH (J-24), two Weta trimarans raced by Ben Arthur and myself, and a Sabre 28 skippered by Charlie Mueller. With a light wind from the south, we were by no means certain that we would make it to Sheldrake. In fact, at thestart, the wind dropped to barely a zephyr, and there seemed to be a bit of north-going current. That's my excuse, anyway, because my Weta, HONEY, was on the wrong side of the line at the start and I struggled to get back ontothe pre-start side!

The five boats drifted northwards, looking for wind. IMVICTUS headed for Myers point and seemed to find breeze along the east shore. SNITCH and HONEY found some puffs on the West shore. Ben and Charlie stuck it out in the middle, but were soon left behind there. It took us about an hour to get to Taughannock, and by that time the wind had filled in a little, still from the south. By this time, INVICTUS had a solid lead, with HONEY second and SNITCH close behind. The wind continued to build a little, but then the sky became dark. Then the wind dropped to nothing as a steady rain settled in. I was hoping the rain would bring us a fresh northerly breeze to finish the race, but we only had a gentle breeze from the north for a few minutes, then it was calm again. At this point INVICTUS was about at the finish, and SNITCH and HONEY retired from the race, as we both had family coming to meet us at the party. Ben and Charlie both stuck it out, and eventually the wind filled in again from the south. INVICTUS' elapsed time was about 3 hours, Ben's was just over 5 hours, and Charlie's was about five and a half hours.

The rain stopped and we had a great party on my dock at Sheldrake, with succulent shrimp, tasty tandoori chicken, banana bread, corn and hummus, all washed down with plenty of beer.

So, here are the results. Well done to all the competitors, especially Tim and the crew of INVICTUS who win the historic 1902 trophy this year!

Remember, the PHRF ratings assume that you will use a spinnaker. If you do not use a spinnaker, just add 12 points to your rating to find the latitude where you are supposed to turn around.
