50 Miler Overniter Race, Friday, August 5, 2011

The reinstitution of the historic 50 Miler Overniter Race spanning the length of Cayuga Lake was a great success! To my understanding, this epic race of endurance, fortitude and perseverance has taken place annually since the 1940s, but had been abandoned for over 10 years. Talk of bringing it back was met with a flood of mixed emotions, enthusiasm, and tales of horror countered with stories of adventure. As one might imagine, a race of this magnitude draws only the hardiest of sailors. Five worthy boats eagerly presented themselves to reinstitute this epic overnight race from the IYC point, to the northern end of the lake and back. They included Richard Stephens' Corsair 28 TREVELYAN, Bill Pochal's C&C 36 PHOENIX, Clare Fewtrell's J24 MEHITABEL, Tim Bonniwell's Catalina 30 INVICTUS, & Charlie Mueller's Sabre 28 GIPSY MOTH.

The prediction was for 5-7kts out of the south with showers followed by scattered thunderstorms for the next 24 hours. Understandably, the forecast surely troubled the sailors who were on the fence to join us. However, to our great fortune, the weatherman called it wrong. The rain held off and winds were at least twice as good as predicted. At 6:00pm we had a warm southerly 6-8 kts of air to get us started. Almost the entire fleet had their chutes up before crossing the start. As usual, TREVELYAN & MEHITABEL had terrific starts and led the fleet north. Unexpectedly, PHOENIX had some issues with deploying their spinnaker, bringing up the rear of the group. No worries, though. After a few minutes wrestling with the hourglass tangle, they sorted it out and promptly made their way out into the middle of the lake, making trees on the competition. The fleet held together pretty well up until Myers point. After which, TREVELYAN slowly proceeded to distance themselves from the group. As the evening progressed, the winds built and we saw up to 14kts, oscillating from SSW to SSE. It truly was "fair winds and following seas!"

Heading north, the only jockeying for positions happened between INVICTUS & MEHITABEL who changed places multiple times. TREVELYAN was first to reach G "51A" just after sunset and only 3.5 hours. They were followed in order by PHOENIX, INVICTUS, MEHITABEL & GIPSY MOTH. Remarkably, all boats reached the mark in nearly 4.5 hours or less.

On the return trip, we enjoyed partly cloudy skies, a half moon and south winds ranging from 10-17kts. We lost the moon near 2am, but were entertained by a magnificent star and meteor show. In the vicinity of Aurora, INVICTUS was able to pass PHOENIX and take second position in the fleet. TREVELYAN's stern light was visible and noted to continue to pull away until it was lost near Myers point.

TREVELYAN won line hours, crossing just before 3am. As the rest of the fleet neared the finish, the winds finally began to wane, dropping to less than 5kts. The next three boats finished within a half an hour of each other in the order of INVICTUS, PHOENIX, & MEHITABEL. GIPSY MOTH cleaned up the fleet, crossing near 6:30am. In the following chart, you can see the corrected times and order of place. The trophy goes to INVICTUS.

Congratulations to all boats and crew! The race turned out to be great fun for all. The weather was magnificent and all reports thus far have been very favorable. Nighttime sailing certainly takes preparation and careful planning. In the right conditions, it changes your perspective on our beautiful

lake and can be quite exhilarating. I expect we will see this race again next year and in the years to come.
