First Latitude Race, Sunday, June 30

Here is the race report by Charles Witherup:

The weather forecast was perfect for a day at the beach - a sunny and windless mid 80s. Alas! Weather forecasting is still an art and not, apparently, so much a science as the winds were at 11-16 kts out of the NNW for all of the race and most of the afternoon to boot. Thus it turned out to be a perfect day for sailing.

Four boats showed up to compete in this, the first race of the latitude series: Clare Fewtrell's J/24 *Mehitabe*l (captained by Brett Davis), David Feavearyear's J/24 *Snitch*, Tim Bonniwell's Catalina 30 (tall mast) *Invictus* and the Durkees' Cape Dory 28 *Quetzal III* (captained by Susan Swensen).

We raced to the C set of latitudes going on the feeling that the wind forecast might have some hint of truth to it and that the winds might die. As it happens, the race was lively and was over quite quickly - with the last boat crossing the line only 1h37 after starting. Tim won the race. David came next. Then Clare. We (Q3) finished, too.
