We sincerely hope that you've enjoyed the summer series so far! We've had some quiet races, some that were just fine and one heck of a screamer. Turns out that this week was more of the former than the latter but not so much that you'd know it ahead of time!

Well, I mean, you'd know that it was not likely to be a screamer but the forecasts (really, all of the ones I saw, darn it!) showed wind right through and always from the same direction. "From the same direction" is generally a good sign! And "the forecasts" is another as well. Alas! Oh, alas...

The weather was great when we arrived at the Yacht club – 70s and sunny, blowing 6-8 from some northerly direction. Great for some sailing! Your ever-intrepid Race Committee (oh yeah – me again!) called for going to the D latitude! I was voted down by every skipper present and we 'compromised' on their choice of C.

Tim was there with *Invictus* (Catalina 30), Bill had *Little Wing* (Catalina 32), Eberhard had *Fantasy* (Tanzer 25), Susan had *Quetzal iii* (Cape Dory 28), Richard had *Trevelyan* (Corsair 28) and David had *Snitch* (J/24). There were a few small crew changes like Keith helming *Trevelyan* (Richard was just back from honeymoon and was, ahem, asleep at the wheel for much of the race) and me abandoning the ladies on *Qiii* to sail with Tim...

So, the race... Well, first off let me congratulate *Little Wing*'s crew on defying expectations – they *can* finish one of those races where you just bob around! Next I should probably congratulate *Snitch* on their race – they found wind where none of the other boats could and seemed to shoot right up the shore. Oh, and they didn't lose any crew overboard, either. And

they finished some very long time before anyone else! Congratulations *Qiii* on sticking with things for as long as you did! It really, literally and honestly, had to have taken over an hour and a half for you to cross the starting line! Good job, *Fantasy*, on sticking with it and finishing – even with the 4 hours it took you!

We started with rather less wind than when we showed up. More along the lines of 3-4 kts. That seemed to hold, kind of, for a while. The boats more to the West side of the lake were moving along at nearly 3 kts boatspeed for 35 minutes or more. The East side of the lake is another story – part of which you've already heard. Indeed, *Quetzal* went East for the start and clearly did not cross the line in the first half hour. While all of the way to the West *Snitch* didn't seem to stop at all...

Invictus, seeing *Snitch* scoot along so well, popped a chute to tack backwards in the direction that should lead earliest to *Snitch*'s windline. There was some success in this tactic in that *Invictus* moved and in the intended direction. There were still 15 solid minutes in all of this part where there was no wind and the only boat moving forward appeared to be *Snitch*.

As *Snitch* had already crossed her A latitude by this point I took the (worsening) weather into account and shortened the course to the B latitude (B as in Beneficent or just plain Beautiful). "Worsening" as in "getting ever quieter" (although, what's quieter than not blowing?). We could see a sailboat coming down the lake from above Myer's – flying her spinnaker fully and proudly! We could also do the mental math... So... Winds from the North... Full sail... Must be blowing at least 5. That boat is at least 3 miles away... It will take that wind well over half an hour to get to us!

But it did get to us eventually! And most of us went to our latitudes (and *Qiii* crossed the starting line and went up the lake some!) and we came back. *Snitch, Little Wing* and *Fantasy* were all becalmed (at different times) near the finish line while *Invictus* and *Trevelyan* seemed to (just barely) be able to keep sails full enough to cross without that final indignity (although *Invictus* was only actually moving for 1h10 of the last 2 hours of the race so there was plenty of becalming – just not at the end). *Qiii* got becalmed (again!) before reaching her latitude and the crew decided to go for a mid-race swim before motoring back.
