## We Raced!

Yesterday we raced! We raced like the wind! We raced!

Yes, we raced like the wind. We raced in every direction, at every speed and with wonton disregard for the proper word to use in a sentence (although some of us did wantonly enjoy our Asian dumplings after racing). Sorry for the liberties I'm taking in describing the adventure of it all – I just like to try and keep things exciting and interesting for those who weren't able to join us on the water as well as those who were.

So, yes... Well, it wasn't really windy or sunny or hot or cold or much at all around the time of the start of the first race. The race committee (Mr. Fleet Captain Hisself) called a course of WAWN. But the winds died. And they switched from not much South to not much North. The RC changed the course to NANW and we were off at a good clip! And the North winds picked up from not much to exciting – 18kts gusting 28kts as measured at Myers – where they stayed for nearly a half hour. So we screamed through this course with the last boat crossing in only 45 minutes.

The RC set a second course of CSF – expecting the madcap winds to hold. Well, they certainly did for the first long leg up to **C**rowbar. This leg saw *Trevelyan*, Richard Stephens' Corsair 28r, with a scrap of jib and reefed main, passed at many points, even past **F**ar Maplewood and nearing the mark, by the J/24s *Mehitabel* of Clare Fewtrell and *Snitch* of David Feavearyear. John Ford's Catalina 27, *Shawondasee*, helmed by Susan Witherup, and *Arcadia*, Mic Tulumello's O'Day 27 followed at what I like to think was a respectably close distance.

But the winds tapered off. Down to 15kts by 3PM and then down to 5kts at 4PM. For the boats that hadn't finished by this time viz. *Arcadia* and *Shawondasee* it become quite a slog to finish. Indeed, *Arcadia* retired from the race and *Shawondasee* only succeeded in finishing an hour after the last J through sheer willpower, tenacity (with Jamie at the helm at this point), skill, good humor, great looks and, of course, impeccable humility.

I suppose I do have to mention, as well, that it poured buckets for at least 10 minutes and then sprinkles for another half hour at some point during this race, too. Things were really quite exciting on the water with rapidly changing wind speeds and directions for much of the windier periods (everything up through 3:30). Sure – we flew chutes for the downwind legs (*Arcadia* aside) but everyone was all over the place. Boats were more losing their chutes than rocking back and forth, but it was still quite shifty (and exciting).
