## And the season endeth

Where to begin with the end? There's so much to recount! We had weather, we had races, we had camaraderie, we had food, we had final results on the season! Since I've gotten my page setup back this week I'll try to keep things more linear for you. So... We we'll start with the weather.

It was Father's Day! So I thought that my kids would be out with me for sailing and a BBQ. Why not? What a great way to spend a day! We woke to 60 and drizzly but the forecast said the rain would stop by noon and the wind might pick up at some point a bit later. Well, that was fine. I'd still bring them out. I pushed the arrival of our crew at the boat back by a <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> hour – to give the rain time to really stop and for our sailing adventure to be the best possible. As we got closer to noon, however, the forecast said that maybe the rain would stop by 5:45 and the winds might still arrive at some point... We decided not to torture our children by bringing them out and we headed off, childless, to IYC.

At IYC it was still drizzling, of course, and the wind wasn't anything to speak of. In the harbor the anemometers weren't even turning... But Myers and Pile Cluster were both showing 10kts – something was going on but we just couldn't see it from shore. Luckily we were able to talk the Fleet Captain/Race Committee into actually setting a course and we set out to sail it -> EB. Well, get this, once we actually got out of the lee of the hill we could feel this aforementioned 10kts and the RC reset our course to FAN.

We shot off (with *Mehitabel* pulling a lovely dip start – like *we* had planned to do!) and went up and back and around and such. We all got quite wet as it had not stopped raining. The course was finished quickly (under an hour) and the RC set a second course of C. This race seems to have seen more wind but that could just be that we, for the most part, sailed our boats more in the center of the lake and away from the lee – at least getting to the mark. We, ah, right. We. Well, we were, in PHRF order, *Trevelyan, Mehitabel, Snitch, Fantasy* and *Shawondasee* (helmed by Jamie Lloyd this day).

Anyway, we all rounded and popped chutes and headed back. Now... The comments about being "in the lee at IYC" and "having more wind in the middle" might clue you in, some, as to the wind direction. And it might have clued us in, some, as well, although quite a few of us seemed to willfully ignore the fact that it was a NNW wind with plenty of gusting from due W – near shore at any rate. We could have jybed out to the middle and taken a generally stronger and more steady NNW but most of us chose to stay within 500' of the West shore and to take the gusty winds coming over land. It's a bit late to try it again and to see if staying out or staying in was the better course of action but as the case was we were the westernmost boat and we rarely saw below 4kts boat speed and during the Westerly gusts often saw more than 7kts... I guess we finished last, too, so there could have been something to staying more to the East. Well, next time John will remember to do that, I'm sure. If the identical conditions present themselves.
