Two spinnakers got caught on one anchor, one jib got caught on at least one stanchion and one jib lost its tack on the hoist) and this week we ripped... On each other? There wasn't a whole lot else going on!

Fall Series Race 3

So the Fall Series advanced – figuratively. Not literally because, hey, it sure felt like we weren't moving all that much. From 24 minutes in the race to 1:54 in the race our instruments showed a speed of 0.0. Although in that hour and a half we did manage to move around ¾ of a mile in the right direction. As many a racer was heard to say, at least it wasn't hot!

We sailed a shortened course of **W**est Shore, **N**ear Maplewood. That's 2 miles. It took the last boat to cross roughly 2 ½ hours to complete. That's .8 kts average boatspeed. It was rough. Very rough! And you wouldn't believe the number of sail changes we did! From jib 2 to jib 1 to Code 0 to spinnaker to jib 1 to spinnaker to Code 0 to jib 1 -> all in the first mile! Things calmed a bit in the changing of sails after the wind died but when zephyrs dropped in for a visit they as like as not were accompanied by another 2 or 3 sail changes!

Although the race was kind of funny and ironic, too, in a way. We started the race with wind and we finished the race with wind! Why, we finished with enough that many called for a second race! The Race Committee wasn't having any of that and Lauren held steady in canceling the second race on the day. The wind we had experienced during the first race (light and variable) was the forecast for the entire afternoon and, indeed, not long after the second race was called off the winds went to zero again.

We had two starts with four J/24s in the first start and three bigger boats in the second start. Line honors went to *Trevelyan* – the Stephens Corsair 28 (on the market as of last week if you're interested in a super fast and easy to sail boat!) and it looks to me like the race went to *Wild Guinea Pig* – the (new to the Fleet!) Turnbull J/24. She crossed the line a bit ahead of *Snitch* – the Feavearyear J/24 who may have also taken *Trevelyan* on corrected time (don't take my word for anything! Rely on the official online results and standings! Fall results are posted here: http://www.cruisingfleet.org/Results/2020Fall.html). It seems to me that the crossings continued with *Mojito*, the Bonniwell J/112e, *Mehitabel*, the Fewtrell J/24, *Galaxy* (not her real name!) the Ford J/100 and *Adelante* the Bullock J/24.
